

LAUNCESTON WATER BILL:

PETITION FOR PASSING.

Presented by Mr. Innes, April 29; and ordered by the Council to be printed, May 1, 1879.



To the Honorable the Members of the Legislative Council, in Parliament assembled.

We the undersigned Inhabitants of St. Leonards and its vicinity, and of Invermay and its vicinity, desire to bring before your Honorable House that we are exceedingly anxious to be supplied with Water from the Water-works of the Town of Launceston.

That a Bill has been introduced into the House of Assembly, intituled "A Bill to amend the Launceston Water Act, 1878," and passed there, making provision for such supply.

That we have been informed and believe that the said Bill, on being sent up to your Honorable House, has been amended.

That we are desirous that the Bill should pass into law without the proposed amendments, and as introduced into your Honorable House.

We therefore humbly pray that you will be pleased to pass the said Bill as originally introduced into your Honorable House.

And your Petitioners, as in duty bound, will ever pray.
