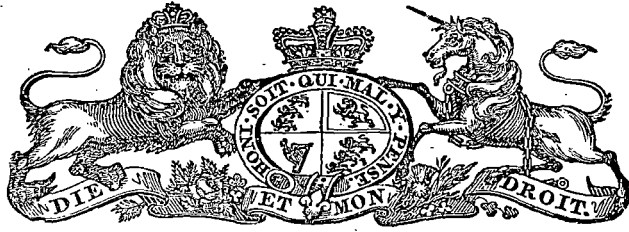

\* An Address to the Governor on the motion of Mr. Allison was voted on the 22nd December, 1856, by the Legislative Assembly, by which His Excellency was asked to place a sum of £31,000 on the Estimates in Aid of Road Trusts and Municipalities. On the following day His Excellency by Message intimated that the item had been omitted, as "the Revenue from existing sources was insufficient to meet the expenditure," but complying "on the understanding that the House will provide the Ways and Means," which was done by the above Acts. (See Assembly Journals, Vol. 1.)

† The Act 25th Victoria, No. 29, provided "for making good the Supplies for the Public Service of the year 1861 and the excesses of expenditure upon certain Public Works." The works are specified in the Schedule to the Act, and were works begun or usually covered by Loans Acts. The 26th Victoria, No. 7, and 27th Victoria, No. 42, provided for Deficiencies in 1862, ascertained when the accounts of that year were closed to have amounted to about £20,000 on the General Revenue. The total sum advanced from General Revenue for Public Works included in the provision under the above Acts was £24,628 18s.; viz.—
