MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 19, 1881.

MINUTE No. 475.

THE Colonial Secretary submits that a Retiring Allowance at the rate of £3 13s. 4d. per annum be granted to Mrs. Agnes Mary Roberts, late Schoolmistress, Westbury Public School.

To take effect on 1st February last, and to be provided for upon a Supplementary Estimate.

And further, that a sum of £22 be placed upon a Supplementary Estimate for the present year, to pay Mrs. Roberts's Pension from 1st January, 1872, to 31st December, 1877; at the same rate.

The Administrator approves.

MINUTE No. 476.

THE following Minute is submitted by the Colonial Secretary :—

That the sum of £17 10s. be placed upon a Supplementary Estimate to pay Mrs. Anne Hammett compensation, at the rate of one month's pay for every year's service, from 1855 to 1858.

Mrs. Hammett would have been entitled to this compensation on the 31st October, 1858, when the school she attended was broken up for a time. She was not re-employed until the 3rd May, 1860, and has been granted a Pension for 21 years' service since that date.
