



TRANSFER OF REAL PROPERTY LAW.

MUNICIPALITY OF CLARENCE.-PETITION No. 1.

Presented by Mr. Abbott, and ordered by the House to be printed, 20 August, 1861.



To the Honorable the House of Assembly of Tasmania, in Parliament assembled.

The Petition of the Municipal Council of Clarence, in Tasmania.

RESPECTFULLY SHOWETH:

That your Petitioners have long felt the great inconvenience in the delay and uncertainty, as well as the serious outlay of money attendant on the present mode of Transfer of Real Property in this Colony, and have noticed that a more simple and less expensive system has been for some time in operation in the neighbouring Colony of South Australia.

Your Petitioners therefore pray that your Honorable House will be pleased during the present Session of Parliament, to mature a measure for simplifying the present Laws relating to the Transfer of Freehold and other interests in Land, by which the evil complained of may be remedied.

And your Petitioners will ever pray.
