



PARLIAMENT OF TASMANIA.

OFFENCES AGAINST THE PERSON BILL, 1885, [No. 22.]:

PETITION FOR INCREASED PROTECTION TO YOUNG FEMALES.

Laid upon the Table by Mr. Fysh, October 7, and ordered by the Legislative Council to be printed, October 8, 1885.



To the Honorable the President and Honorable Members of the Legislative Council of Tasmania, in Parliament assembled.

We, the undersigned Ministers and Office-bearers of the Wesleyan Church, Melville-street, Hobart, in Quarterly Meeting assembled,

RESPECTFULLY SHOWETH:

That a Bill to amend the Law relating to Offences against the Person has been passed by your Honorable House.

That in the said Bill Fourteen years is named as the age under which no child shall be deemed capable of consenting to any indecent assault.

That, in the judgment of your Petitioners, the age above named is far too low.

Your Petitioners therefore pray that your Honorable House will still further increase protection which it is proposed to extend to females, by passing a Bill increasing the age of consent to Sixteen years.

And your Petitioners, as in duty bound, will ever pray, &c.
