

SIR, I HAVE the honor to inform you that His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to appoint you one of the Commissioners under the Launceston and Western Railway Act.

I enclose a copy of the Act for your information and guidance as to the specific powers and duties that will devolve upon you, and in the discharge of which His Excellency the Governor and his Responsible Advisers feel every confidence you will exercise that sound judgment and impartiality the possession of which qualifications has in great measure induced the Government to offer you the appointment.
