R E P O R T.

Your Committee have the honor to report that they have carefully entered into the consideration of the matter referred to them, and have unanimously agreed to the following Resolutions, which they have now the honor to submit to the House:—

1st. That the Committee are of opinion that there should be some proper and efficient means of having the proceedings of the House recorded; but the Committee have not before them at present sufficient information to warrant them in making any definite proposals as to the mode in which this should be done.

2nd. That the Colonial Secretary be requested to communicate with the authorities in the other Colonies during the recess, with the view of obtaining information as to the manner in which Parliamentary reporting is conducted in each; also, as to the expenses connected therewith, and any further particulars which may be thought necessary.
