

LAUNCESTON AND WESTERN RAILWAY ACT AMENDMENT BILL.

PETITION IN FAVOUR OF FROM MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF DELORAINE.

Presented by Sir R. Dry, February 5; and ordered by the Council to be printed, February 6, 1867.



To the Honorable the President and Honorable Members of the Legislative Council, in Parliament assembled.

The humble Petition of the Municipal Council of Deloraine.

That your Petitioners have heard with great satisfaction that a Bill to amend the Launceston and Deloraine Railway Act has passed the Honorable the House of Assembly, and has been read a first time in your Honorable House; knowing, as your Petitioners do, that the construction of this Railway is earnestly desired by a large majority of the Ratepayers and others of the various Districts through which it is intended to pass, and that it cannot but tend to benefit the whole community.
