1 The House met at Ten o'clock a.m.

2 ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF TRADITIONAL PEOPLE. - The Speaker made a statement acknowledging the traditional people of the land.

**3** PRAYERS AND REFLECTION. – The Speaker read Prayers.

4 QUESTIONS SEEKING INFORMATION. – In accordance with Standing Order No. 43, Questions without notice were asked.

**5** PETITION. – Ms *O'Connor* presented an E-Petition from approximately 13,519 citizens of Tasmania, requesting that the House call on the Government to end the taxpayer subsidy of the inherently cruel greyhound racing industry. (HA10/2022).

**6** SUBORDINATE LEGISLATION, JOINT STANDING COMMITTEE ON: REPORT BROUGHT UP. – Mr *Tucker* brought up the following Report of the Joint Standing Committee on Subordinate Legislation:
