With regard to the questions asked by the Town Clerk, Melbourne, with reference to the Procedure of the House of Assembly, Tasmania, concerning the Circulation of Bills, the following information is supplied:-

The Procedure is laid down by -

1. Standing Order No. 225. When a Bill has been read a First time it shall be printed with as little delay as possible, and a copy shall be provided for each Member by the Clerk of the House.
2. Standing Order No. 227. A Bill (not being a Bill brought in in compliance with an Order of the House, nor a Bill received from the Legislative Council) shall not be read a Second time until Seven days after printed copies shall have been distributed to Members.

Note with regard to above -


- (i) Bills received from the Legislative Council are dealt with in accordance with S.O. No. 268, viz., 268. Bills coming to this House the first time from the Legislative Council shall be proceeded with in all respects as similar Bills presented in pursuance of Orders of the House.
- (ii) A Bill brought in in compliance with an Order of the House refers to Bills giving effect to Resolutions agreed to by the House, e.g., Public Works Extension Bills, Appropriation Bills, etc. Such Bills are generally read the Second time forthwith, as the same stand in the Schedule of Bills which have already been dealt with in

(em) Committee on the Whole House or Committee of Supply.

(iii) In addition to Members receiving draft Bills as soon as read the First time and printed, copies are also supplied to all Newspapers, Public Offices, and various Institutions who ask for copies of all Bills (such as Law Societies, Libraries, etc.)

With regard to the Question whether the Council receives copies of Bills on the First Reading in the House of Assembly, the answer is in the Affirmative.

I have the honour to transmit herewith my Estimates of the probable Expenditure for the House of Assembly for the Financial Year ending June 30, 1921, and in support thereof I desire to make the following observations:-

The Clerk of the House.

I have completed nearly 37 years of public service, and during the last 25 years I have occupied the important and responsible position of Clerk of the House. As Clerk of the House and Librarian to Parliament I now receive £550 per annum. I am also Secretary of the Public Works Committee, for which I receive £50 per annum. Several other Heads of Department also hold minor offices for which they receive small remuneration, but such remuneration is not considered as part of their Salaries as Heads of Department.

For very many years the Salary of my Office was reserved by Law at £400 per annum, and £600 to-day is no more than £400 was at that time, and I therefore respectfully submit that after nearly a quarter of a century in the position my salary for 1920-21 be raised to £600 a year.

The Clerk-Assistant and Sergeant-at-Arms.

Mr. Green, after being absent on Active Service for Four Years, returned to Office during last Session. He has shown conspicuous aptitude in the performance of the duties of his Office, and I regard him as a most efficient and valuable officer, and one whom it is most desirable to retain as an understudy to the Clerk. I therefore recommend that his Salary be increased to £350 a year.

The Assistant-Librarian and Clerk of Papers

This Officer's efficiency in many essential directions is too well known to Ministers and to Honourable Members generally to need more than merely mentioning. He has been in the service of the House for many years, and much of the smoothness in the work of the House is due to his constant readiness and his capacity to assist Members with his skilled knowledge, the result of long experience in obtaining information and data from Blue Books and other records. Mr. McPherson is also Office-keeper, and any allowance he gets as such is fully made up by the confidence and security realised by having such a trustworthy officer in charge of the Buildings and the valuable Library of Parliament. I recommend that his Salary be increased to £300 a year.

Doorkeeper and Messenger

This Officer's Salary was raised by G.C.A. for 1919-20 to £200, and I would recommend that it be fixed at the same amount for 1920-21.

Stationery, Stores, Postal Charges, Telegraphs, Telephone, and Advertising;

I have had to increase my Estimate for 1920-21 under this Heading. The amount voted by Parliament was £100, and during the year I had to apply for a G.C.A. for £25, making £125. The cost of all Stationery and Stores has gone up, and the quantities of Stationery now required by Members has so increased, together with the increased number of telephone calls by Members or on account of Members to distant places, that I feel I cannot safely place a lesser sum than £150 to meet the numerous charges against this Vote.






