I would like you to here my concerns with Tas water , I have a bakery business in Launceston we have been told by Tas water if we want to stay baking we have to put in a Grease trap in ,we have been in business for over thirty years and have had major renovations twice In these times there was a time to put a grease trap in. Our building dose not have room to put in a grease trap in and Tas water or the Launceston City Council have come up with no solutions when we had a site meeting I asked if I could put a grease guardian X in this is a machine that takes the fats out of the water around 90% to 95% .This goes under the sink all stainless steel I was hopping to get a answer at the meeting and was told I have to put a submission to Tas water and the Launceston City Council health department when I rang the city council to ask for someone to come out they told I would get the answers, we need to make sure Tasmanian Business can get options to comply to the new regulations. The other thing is pay a trade waste tariff of \$874.92 per year and If I put in a grease guardian X in I would be putting hardly any waste in to the Tas water system and still have to pay the tariff and domestic house pay nothing to put waste down the drains Tas water is a company Owned buy the Councils of Tasmania we were told we have 18 months to put our grease traps in but they haven't give the same time to fix there treatment plants that don't comply to the standards and put sewerage in to the Tamar river.

My options should to put catches in all the sinks in the bakery and to continue scrape all trays ,pots, bowls in to the bin before washing and still pay the tariff or put in the grease guardian X in and the catches in the sinks and pay know tariffs.

This is a big thing of owners of business in the State we need people employed we have a lot of old buildings that aren't easy to put grease traps in the EPA told me the grease guardian X was approved under PDI and ASME .And complies with the following standards for grease interceptors and removal devices ASM A112.14.3 ASME A112.14.4 CSA B481 PDI 101.
