The Hobart Town (1804) First Settlers Association Inc. was formed forty years ago. Its annual major event is the FLORAL TRIBUTE each 20th FEBRUARY at the Hunter Street Monument unveiled by HM Queen Elizabeth 11 in 1954 the 150th anniversary of the arrival of Lieut. Governor David Collins and party of marines, administrative assistants, free settlers and convicts to form a garrison settlement on the Derwent. From this small beginning and including Bowen's group has grown Hobart and it's hinterland.

The Society's membership is now about 200 from Tasmania, Australia and other countries. The membership has grown from descendants of Collins' party to include descendants of Norfolk Islanders and early settlers(convict and free). Past Presidents have included Richard Lord, Henry Baldwin and Freda Gray OAM. Schooltrips are also a significant contributer to the tourist industry, and for local children such activities add to their education and their development of identity.
