



## PARLIAMENT OF TASMANIA.

## GEORGE TOWN TO EAST ARM ROAD:

PETITION.

Presented by Mr. Conway, September 8, and ordered by the House of Assembly to be printed, September 15, 1886.



To the Honorable Members of the House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled.

The humble Petition of the undersigned Landholders of the District of Lower Piper River, Glen, Lefroy, East Tamar,

## RESPECTFULLY SHOWETH:

That the opening of a road from the 19th mile-post on the George Town Road to East Arm, on the River Tamar, a distance of about four miles, would enable the majority of the settlers of this District to get their produce to a good and safe shipping-place within a distance of 15 miles, thereby lessening the haulage of their produce by one-half.

The farmers at the East Arm on the River Tamar have no authorised road whatever to their farms, which makes the case most urgent to have the said road made.

Your Petitioners pray that your Honorable House will enact such measures as may, in your wisdom, best give relief to your Petitioners.

And your Petitioners will ever pray.
