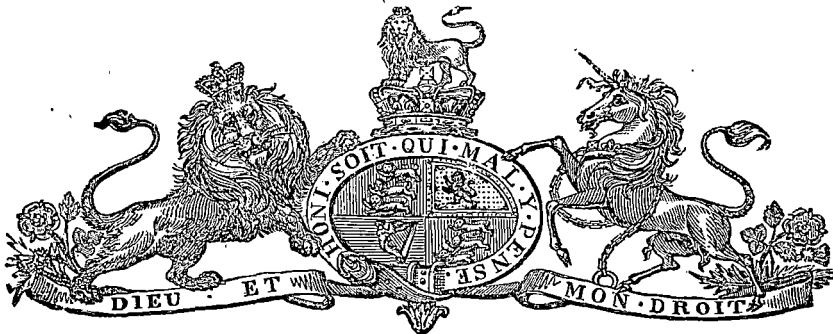

To the Honorable the House of Assembly of Tasmania, in Parliament assembled.

The Petition of the undersigned Inhabitants of the Road Districts of Franklin, Victoria, and Honeywood, on the River Huon.

RESPECTFULLY SHOWETH :

THAT a considerable majority of the Ratepayers of the above united Districts, who are qualified to do so, have signed a Memorial to the Governor in Council, praying that these united Districts may be separated from the rest of the Franklin Police District, and formed into a Rural Municipality.

That your Petitioners, living in an inland part of the District, quite exceptional to the remainder of the scattered Franklin Police District, which is mostly seaboard, and with the inhabitants of which they have very little connection or identity of interest, anxiously desire to obtain the privilege of Municipal Government.

That your Petitioners therefore earnestly request your Honorable House to afford every assistance to enable the Government to grant the prayer of the before-mentioned Memorial.
