

DESPATCH FROM SECRETARY OF STATE :

DEPARTURE OF SIR G. C. STRAHAN FOR TASMANIA.

SIR,

WITH reference to your Despatch No. 43 of the 22nd April last, I have the honor to inform you that the word "Serrahan" in my telegraphic Despatch of the 21st April was, as you suppose, incorrectly transmitted in place of Strahan.

Sir George Strahan arrived in this Country from Barbados on the 14th instant, and has applied to be allowed to postpone his departure for Tasmania until the 1st of December next. I have intimated to Sir George Strahan my consent to this arrangement, on the understanding that, should circumstances arise which would appear to require his presence in Tasmania, he will be prepared to embark by an earlier opportunity.
