

Police Office, Swansea, 6th August, 1864.

Sir,

In reference to a Return which I furnished to you a few days ago of undetected Murders in this District, I have the honor to inform you that I unintentionally fell into error in making out a *Nil* Return. I now hasten to supply the omission of the Murder of a man named *George Spratt*, who was murdered in Glamorgan on or about the 10th November, 1859, and whose Murderer has never been discovered.

B. TRAVERS SOLLY. 9 August, 1864.

A MAN named "Vigor" was tried for this Murder at Oatlands; and though the evidence was of the strongest nature, and a portion of the clothing of the deceased found upon him, he was acquitted. He was subsequently convicted of shooting at Mr. Massey, condemned and executed; and prior to his death, though he never confessed to the Murder, made admissions which left no doubt on my mind as to his guilt. I did not, therefore, include his name in the Return furnished to the House of Assembly.
