



PARLIAMENT OF TASMANIA.

MUNICIPAL POLICE:

INSPECTOR'S REPORT, 1889.

Presented to both Houses of Parliament by His Excellency's Command.



Police Department, Inspector's Office, Hobart, 25th June, 1890.

I HAVE the honor to submit my Annual Report upon the Police appointed for the several Municipalities within the Colony for the year 1889, in accordance with Section 7 of "The Police Regulation Act, 1865."

I visited the whole of the Municipalities during the year, and frequently met the Superintendents and other police officers.

The staff maintained in each Municipality was sufficient in point of numbers and efficiency for the preservation of the peace and for general protection and security.

The stations were found to be in good order and repair, with the exception of some few of the out-stations, which were, and are still, in a very bad condition. There are some old buildings dilapidated and beyond repair, which are unfit for occupation, nevertheless they are still used; they are generally buildings which were handed over by the Government when the Municipalities were established. No provision has been made by Parliament for the erection of new buildings in Municipalities, and the local Councils cannot meet the heavy expenditure which would be involved. if they undertook the work. In every instance where this difficulty has been experienced, the full Police Rate of Ninepence in the Pound has been levied, and there is naturally an indisposition to impose further taxation for the purpose of Police buildings.

I append the usual Returns and particulars of the Police Establishment in each Municipality.

The Superintendent and two Constables have forage. The Superintendent has £5 per annum as Inspector, Health Act.

k With uniform. The Sub-Inspector, Sergeant, and 2 Constables have quarters. The Watch-house Keeper has fuel and light. The Superintendent is Council Clerk, &c. at £30 per annum.

All the Force have quarters, or allowance in lieu thereof, and uniform. The Superintendent, Sergeant, and two Constables have £15 per annum each forage allowance. The Constable is Council Clerk, with a salary of £60 per annum, and has fuel and light. The Sergeant and two Constables have fuel and light. The Superintendent has £5 per annum as Inspector, Health Act.

With uniform and quarters in addition. The Superintendent has £25 per annum, Sub-Inspector and 4 Constables £10 each, forage allowance. The Sub-Inspector has fuel and light.

With quarters and, except in case of Superintendent, uniform, in addition. The Superintendent has £5 as Town Surveyor. One Sub-Inspector has £20 and one Constable £25 per annum for forage. Two Sub-Inspectors have fuel and light, and 1 Sub-Inspector £90 per annum as Council Clerk.

With uniform, and, except in case of the Superintendent, quarters. The Superintendent has £25 per annum forage allowance. The Sub-Inspector has £10 and Constable £10 per annum forage allowance. The Superintendent has £5 as Inspector, Health Act. The Sub-Inspector has fuel and light.

With uniform and, except in case of Superintendent, quarters. The Superintendent has £25 per annum, two Sub-Inspectors and two Constables £12 10s. each, forage allowance. One Sub-Inspector and 1 Sergeant have fuel and light. Two Sub-Inspectors, 1 Sergeant, and 1 Constable receive £1 6s. per annum boot allowance.
