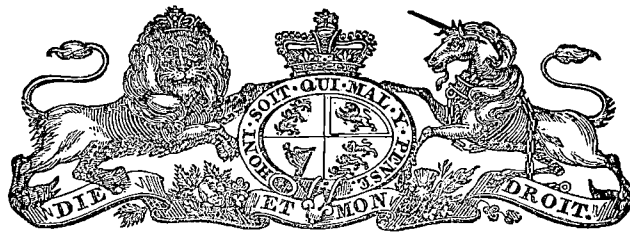

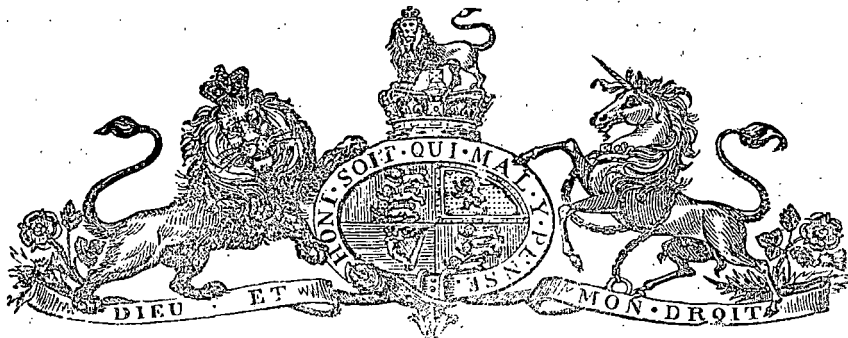

ANNUAL REPORT of the TASMANIAN COUNCIL OF EDUCATION for the Year 1875-76.

To His Excellency **FREDERICK ALOYSIUS WELD, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Tasmania and its Dependencies.**

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY.

1. In conformity with the provisions of "The Tasmanian Council of Education and Scholarship Act," we have the honor to submit this our Sixteenth Report embracing the proceedings of the Council between the 1st May, 1875, and the 30th April, 1876. 22 Vict. No. 21, Section 30.

2. The Rev. Canon Davenport was re-elected President for the year ending 30th June, 1876. President.

3. We caused an Examination of Candidates for the Council of Education Exhibitions to be held in the month of June, 1875. Fourteen Students presented themselves for examination; four were rejected at the preliminary Examination, and on the recommendation of the Examiners, Exhibitions of the annual value of £20 each for four years were awarded to Edwin Maxey, pupil of Mr. W. W. Fox, B.A., Horton College, Ross, and Frederick Lodge, pupil of Mr. H. M. Pike, City School, Hobart Town. Four others obtained a standard of marks sufficient to entitle them to an Exhibition. Council of Education Exhibitions, Gazette Notice, 22 June, 1875.

The Examiners in closing their Report on the Examination observe:—

"We are gratified to observe that four boys, besides the first two on the list, have reached the standard of qualification for an Exhibition. The highest number of marks is a little greater than last year. The work, however, on the whole, is inferior to that of last year, the average number of marks obtained by the candidates being less than at the preceding Examination. Nevertheless, we are of opinion that the attainments of the candidates generally, and especially of the two who have been recommended for Exhibitions, reflect great credit on their ability and industry, as well as on the masters of the schools at which they have been instructed."

4. The Eighteenth Examination for the Degree of Associate of Arts was held in September, 1875; the Rev. J. E. Bromby, D.D., Melbourne, being Examiner in English, Latin, Greek, Pure Mathematics, Natural Philosophy, and Geology; the Hon. F. S. Dobson, M.A., LL.D., Examiner in French and German; Professor Charles H. Pearson, M.A., Ladies College, Melbourne, Examiner in Italian; Rev. W. W. Spicer, M.A., F.R.S., Examiner in Zoology and Botany; and Mr. Henry Hunter, Examiner in Drawing. Twelve Candidates under nineteen years of age presented themselves; all passed the Preliminary Examination, and nine succeeded in obtaining the Degree: four being placed in the First Class and five in the Second Class. Degree of Associate of Arts, Gazette Notice, 5th October, 1875.

Four Candidates over nineteen years of age presented themselves: three obtained the Degree, one female Candidate in the Second Class, and one male and one female Candidate in the Third Class.

5. Neil Elliott Lewis, as Senior Associate of the year, received the Council's Gold Medal, and First Prizes of the value of £10 each for English, French, and Mathematics. To George Archibald MacMillan, who was placed in the First Class, were awarded First Prizes of the value of £10 each for Latin and Greek, and a Second Prize of the

value of £5 for Italian. To Algernon Townsend Creswell, who was also placed in the First Class, were awarded Second Prizes of the value of £5 each for Latin, Greek, and Mathematics. Beatrice Mary Pike, who was also placed in the First Class, obtained First Prizes of the value of £10 each for German and Italian, a Second Prize of the value of £5 for English, and a Second Prize for French. To John George Lindsay, who was placed in the Second Class, was awarded a Second Prize for French, and Isabel Agnes Gibson, who was also placed in the Second Class, gained a Second Prize of the value of £5 for German.

The Examiners in closing their Report observe :—

When the Examiners are changed, the comparison between one year and another cannot be so precise as when the same Examiners continue from year to year; but there is every reason to believe that the Candidates under 19 have this year acquitted themselves remarkably well. The examination is distinguished by one female attaining a position in the first class.”

Tasmanian Scholarships, *Gazette* Notice, 5th Nov., 1875.

6. The Examination for Tasmanian Scholarships in September last was conducted by the Rev. J. E. Bromby, D.D. Six Candidates presented themselves; four satisfied the conditions prescribed for the award of a Scholarship; viz.—

Arthur Pitcairn Canaway, A.A., 1873.
Alfred Doran, A.A., 1873.
Charles James Pike, A.A., 1873; and
William Harvey Buckland, A.A., 1874.

The available Scholarships were awarded to the two first named, and they have since proceeded to Great Britain to enter upon their University studies.

Tasmanian Scholars.

7. We learn that Canaway has distinguished himself since his arrival in England by obtaining a first place in a recent open contest for a Junior Studentship at Christ Church, Oxford, in February last, and that J. W. H. Geiss, Tasmanian Scholar of 1871, passed in Jurisprudence in the course of the last term of 1875.

Gilchrist Scholarship.

8. The Third Examination for the Scholarship of £100 per annum for three years offered biennially by the “Trustees of the Gilchrist Education Trust” to the youth of this Colony, commenced on the 30th July last and extended over six days. Only one Candidate, Charles James Pike, A.A., 1873, presented himself. The papers worked by him, under our supervision, were forwarded under seal to the authorities in England through Your Excellency, and a communication was subsequently received notifying that he had been successful in gaining the Scholarship.

Dry Scholarship.

9. The Dry Scholarship was awarded to Neil Elliott Lewis, the Senior Associate of the year, he having intimated his intention to proceed with his studies and compete for a Tasmanian Scholarship.

Local examination for Matriculation at Melbourne University.

10. Since the publication of our last Report an Examination of Candidates for Matriculation at the University of Melbourne, October term, has been held in Hobart Town under our supervision. Two Candidates, one male and one female, presented themselves, the former in Latin only, in which subject he passed.

11. On the 10th June, 1875, we presented to Your Excellency a Supplementary Report recommending certain changes in our constitution, with a view to the formation

of a Tasmanian University, and a "Bill to confer additional powers on the Council of Education" was afterwards prepared and submitted to Parliament in accordance with the recommendations therein contained.

12. We submit a Statement of the Disbursements of the Council between the 1st January and the 31st December, 1875, the termination of the financial year; together with a Supplementary Statement of Payments between the 1st January and the 30th April, 1876. The total expenditure under every head for the year 1875 is shown to have amounted to £1527 8s. 0d. Financial Statement.

13. We append to our Report a Roll of the Tasmanian Scholars, a List of those Students who have obtained the Degree of Associate of Arts, and a List of those who obtained Exhibitions offered by the Council. Appendix A, B, and C.
