

#### THE CIRCULAR HEAD MARINE BOARD.

THE Governor directs the publication of By-Law No. 11 made by the Circular Head Marine Board for the purpose of regulating Pilotage Rates for Steam Vessels entering Duck River or Robbins Passage.

By-Law made by the Circular Head Marine Board, under and by virtue of the Acts of the Parliament of Tasmania, 21 Victoria, No. 16, and 31 Victoria, No. 30:---

#### Bye-Law, No. 11.

Pilotage Rates for Steam Vessels.

That from and after the 1st day of May, 1883, the Pilotage Rates for steam vessels entering Duck River or Robbins Passage (unless holding a certificate of exemption) shall be—

Threepence per ton inwards, and Threepence per ton outwards. Anything contained in Bye-Law No. 3 to the contrary notwithstanding.

Made and passed by the Circular Head Marine Board, when the whole of the Members were present, this second day of March, 1883.
