

I HAVE the honor to forward the usual annual Report for this Institution for the year 1877.

On the 1st January, 1877, the number of Inmates was	123 137

Remaining on the 31st December, 1877	•••	120

Of those discharged 3 were transferred to General Hospital, 1 to Asylum for Insane, 9 to Brickfields Depôt, Hobart Town, and 3 to Police Office for misconduct.

Two hundred and sixty cases of sickness occurred during the year.

The average age at the time of death was 69 180.

The conduct of the Inmates has been good.

The rations supplied by various contractors were good.

Appended is a statement showing the expenditure for the year, and the average cost per head.
