Notices of Motion

- 52** The Minister for Primary Industries and Water to move—That the House:—
- (1) Acknowledges and pays tribute to the thousands of Tasmanian women who contribute to our vitally important agricultural sector and rural communities.
 - (2) Notes that the AgriFutures Rural Women's Award is the pre-eminent award for rural women which recognises past achievements and supports further development of outstanding women in Tasmania's vibrant agricultural sector.
 - (3) Recognises that in 2020 there was an excellent and diverse field for the Tasmanian AgriFutures Awards and this is testament to the strength and vibrancy of Tasmania's rural women.
 - (4) Congratulates the Tasmanian winner of the 2020 AgriFutures Award, Karen Brock, who recently represented Tasmania at the national awards with her project based around plant tissue culture and food security production systems.
 - (5) Further notes that Tasmanian Women in Agriculture provide bursaries for our finalists for training and development opportunities, and acknowledges their support in providing opportunities for our rural women to shine.
 - (6) Further congratulates the recipients of the awards sponsored by the Tasmanian Women in Agriculture - Louise Morris, the winner of the Encouragement Award and a \$2,000 training bursary, and Robyn Eversole and Celia Leverton who were each awarded \$1,000 Development Awards.
 - (7) Further recognises that the Tasmanian Government is a strong supporter of the AgriFutures Rural Women's Award, and is proud to provide this support in partnership with AgriFutures, Westpac, the ABC and other major sponsors. (27 October 2021)
- 53** Ms Dow to move—That the House:—
- (1) Acknowledge that:—
 - (a) the Tasmanian Government released its Roadmap to Reopen, 'Reconnecting Tasmania: our safe border reopening plan', on 22 October 2021; and
 - (b) quarantining remains an important part of the plan to reopen our borders.
 - (2) Notes:—
 - (a) the recent breach of Home Quarantine in Launceston and Hotel Quarantine in Hobart;
 - (b) that the breach of Hotel Quarantine by a COVID-19 positive man led to a 3 day lockdown of Southern Tasmania; and
 - (c) that the Tasmanian Government undertook a home quarantine trial for travellers returning from regional NSW for one month starting Friday 24 September 2021.
 - (3) Calls on the Premier to:—

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- (a) table the reports of the reviews into the breaches and the home quarantine trial; and
- (b) provide a detailed update to Parliament on steps taken to address the findings of the reviews of quarantine breaches and the outcomes of the home quarantine trial for travellers returning from regional NSW. (27 October 2021)

54 Ms O'Byrne to move—That the House:—

- (1) Notes:—
 - (a) with concern plans by the Flinders Island Bureau of Meteorology to reduce its 24 hour service to the Island Terminal Aerodrome to a 12 hour (daylight saving) service;
 - (b) that the Island's remote geographical location combined with frequent rapidly changing adverse weather, places the Island at some vulnerability in relation to accurate forecasting;
 - (c) that this decision has caused significant concern to the local community, aviation services and to the local fishing industry;
 - (d) it may have impact on the availability of aero-medical retrievals and for rescue services, in particular to the deployment of roto wing search and rescue aircraft; and
 - (e) it is unlikely to produce significant cost savings to the Bureau.
- (2) Calls upon the Tasmanian Government to make urgent representations to their Federal counterparts to reverse this decision. (27 October 2021)
