- **1 COUNCIL MEETS.** The Council met at 11.00 o'clock in the forenoon and the President read Prayers.
- **PAPERS.** The Acting Clerk of the Council laid upon the Table the Response to the Commonwealth Government's Horizontal Fiscal Equalisation Proposal. Productivity Commission Inquiry into Horizontal Fiscal Equalisation: Commonwealth Government Response. Department of Treasury and Finance Analysis.
- **3 BILL NO. 53.** The Water and Sewerage Legislation (Corporate Governance and Pricing) Amendment Bill 2018 was read the Third time and passed.
