1 The House met at Ten o'clock a.m.

2 ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF TRADITIONAL PEOPLE. - The Speaker made a statement acknowledging the traditional people of the land.

3 PRAYERS AND REFLECTION. – The Speaker read Prayers.

4 QUESTIONS SEEKING INFORMATION. – In accordance with Standing Order No. 43, Questions without notice commenced.

5 MEMBER SUSPENDED. – In accordance with Standing Order 149, the Speaker directed the Honourable Member for Lyons, Ms *White*, to withdraw from the House for the remainder of Question Time owing to repeated interjections.

6 QUESTIONS SEEKING INFORMATION. – Questions without notice continued and concluded.

7 PETITION. - Mrs *Rylah* presented a Petition from approximately 39 citizens of Tasmania, requesting that the House call on the Government to:

- (1) Retain the Arthur Pieman Conservation Area, the Western Tasmania Aboriginal Cultural Landscape and State Reserves (Sundown Point and West Point) as public areas for the whole community.
- (2) Manage the area focusing on continued public access inclusive of the whole community with an emphasis on education, recreational activities, public participation and not discriminate against any individual or group of people. (HA6/2019)

20 SESSIONAL ORDERS. – A Motion being made and the Question being proposed – That the Sessional Orders be amended as follows: -

- (1) The Sessional Order replacing Standing Order 42 be amended as follows:-
 - (a) leave out "Other Members", wherever occurring, and insert instead "Greens Members";
 - (b) after paragraph (b), by inserting the following new paragraph
 "(ba) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (a) and the weekly rotations prescribed in paragraph (b), the Independent Member for Clark, may, once in every four sitting weeks, call on an item of Private Members Business at Noon to 1.00 p.m."
- (2) Sessional Order 48A is amended by leaving out "and two by other members" and insert instead, ", two by Members of the Greens and one by the Independent Member for Clark if such Member seeks the call". (The Minister for Infrastructure and Transport)

An Amendment was proposed by Ms O'Connor after clause (2) by adding the following new clause:-

- (3) The following new Sessional Order is inserted after Sessional Order 48A:-
- 48B Maximum time for Questions and Answers

Notwithstanding the provisions of standing order 48, the Speaker shall ensure the time taken to ask a Question does not exceed one minute, and the time taken to answer a Question does not exceed four minutes.
