We the under signed would like to put forward our views and experiences.

WE know the main cause of bed shortages in the Royal Hobart Hospital are due to the building work carried out there. We also know that other hospitals are underutilized many beds are left empty the main hospitals as far as New Norfolk could be used

The Norfolk Hospital has a capacity of fourteen beds this could be increased to twenty in our view the wards are big with only two beds

In each of them and currently ten or eleven occupied.

Patients could be sent after operations to recoup it is my belief that one hundred year old or people of great age should not go there, we

Believe the new set out of the Royal Hobart of one and two bed wards is a mistake and there should be some four bed wards.

The emergency ward at the Royal is grossly over crowded when I asked was it big enough the reply was no it is Fine.

One thing that in my stay in the waiting room was the number of police bringing in people who were taken straight in I was unsure of what their complaints were.

The Ambulance service in Hobart are grossly over worked we need more crews and vehicles.

It is unfortunate that some of the crews are assaulted after talking to some we think some training in defence maybe a good idea.

We understand that the blame cannot all be laid at the Honourable

Minister Michael Fergusons feet the State Government and the Federal Government must carry most of the blame.

My personal view is we need more nurses and I am told the reason

Why after nurses have completed their training they are not given a contract and so they leave.

I would like to see nurse's aids back in hospitals and we need more volunteers I think they were called lolly pop ladies.

We do not understand why the State Government will not concentrate on one major project at a time fix it and move on.

There is talk of a new prison being built the cost to do that must be huge we say hospitals should come first not people who break the law if they are over crowed they can wait but sick people cannot.

After speaking to Doctors and Specialists I find that the Royal Hobart Hospital does not send reports of people who are visiting private Doctors and are also attending the Royal.

I live on the eastern Shore and cannot understand why we have not got a hospital over here our super clinic at Rosny is very efficient but is becoming over crowed.

We in this State do not look out for the elderly we feel that when a person is old they should get respect not the treatment they receive

It seems to us that if you are old second class treatment will do it is as if no one cares.

We of the Northern Suburbs Health Committee are worried that if things do not improve and that Governments do not take action the We will not recover and people will die.

There are so many things wrong in this health system that it is hard to know where to start Hospitals is only one part of the problem there are many more

Our committee would be happy to attend your meeting for you to hear the treatment given to them.
