- 1 **COUNCIL MEETS.** The Council met at 11.00 o'clock in the forenoon.
- **2 ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF TRADITIONAL PEOPLE.** The President said: "We meet today on Tasmanian Aboriginal land. We acknowledge and pay respect to the Tasmanian Aboriginal people and elders, past and present. We recognise them as the traditional and original owners and the continuing custodians of this land."
- **PRAYERS.** The President read Prayers.
- **4 MOTION WITHOUT NOTICE.** *Ordered*, That Mrs *Hiscutt* have leave to move a Motion without Notice.
- **5 LEAVE OF ABSENCE.** *Ordered*, That the Honourable Member for Rosevears, (Ms *Palmer*) be granted leave of absence from the service of the Council for this day's sitting. (Mrs *Hiscutt*)
- **6 BILL NO. 4.** The Order of the Day was read for the consideration of the Justice Miscellaneous (Removal of Outdated Sex Terminology) Bill 2023 as amended in Committee of the Whole Council.

Ordered, That the Bill, as amended in the Committee, be now taken into consideration.

The Council, accordingly, proceeded to take the same into consideration.

The Amendments were read the First time.

The said Amendments, being read the Second time, were agreed to.

Ordered, That the Bill as amended in the Committee, be now read the Third time. (Mrs Hiscutt)

The Bill was read the Third time and passed.

Ordered, that the Debate be adjourned. (Mrs Hiscutt)
