## Response to Government Inquiry into Discrimination and Bullying in Tasmanian Schools

This submission addresses the particular areas of (b) and (d) of the terms of reference:

- (b) inquire into and report upon the measures necessary to prevent and remedy discrimination and bullying in Tasmanian schools in regard to students and staff
- (d) examine and recommend what efforts are being made and should be made towards meeting those obligations by Tasmanian schools in regard to students and

We are proud to say that John Paul II Catholic School is a safe place for students. We are a Kinder to Grade Six school of 227 students in Rokeby, Tasmania. We have a wide range of supports in place to cater for every student. We have excellent resources, including two school counsellors and a school chaplain, who are always ready to provide support to students who are in need.

We have implemented several additional measures to ensure our students get to school safely and have the best chance to succeed in school. We offer a bus service each morning and afternoon to remove the barrier of parental transport capacity. This has proven to make a significant improvement to student attendance.

Each morning our caring staff provide a free breakfast and physical activity time so our students can start the day well. Students are involved in making and serving breakfast, as we see this as an opportunity to give our students additional responsibilities and leadership roles. We have also implemented a lunch program, where every student is offered a hot, nutritious lunch every day.

We have zero tolerance for bullying and our clear positive behaviour approach allows explicit teaching of all expected behaviours. We use several programs to encourage respect, courtesy and consideration for others, including Bravehearts - Child sexual abuse prevention, Speak Up Stay Chatty - mental health awareness, Think U Know - Police Cyber Safety Program, along with our own well-being programs delivered by our school counsellor and chaplain. These programs include targeted social skills and friendship development programs designed to teach our students how to be great friends and the behaviours to expect from great friends.

We welcome families from the margins and actively promote partnerships between families and school. Our PAKT (Parents and Kids Together) Program is designed to strengthen family and school relationships, build self-esteem and educate families and students about protective behaviours. Alongside our bus, breakfast and lunch programs, we also provide fee assistance for families in need. We have made a commitment to our community that the inability to pay fees will not impact our students' education.

We believe that an important part of student well-being is experiencing success at school. One element of this is academic success. We use evidence-based programs



which align with current research into the science of learning. Every student participates in targeted literacy and numeracy programs which allow every student to make progress and succeed with their learning. We provide opportunities for students to engage in extension activities and for intervention programs to support accelerated learning. Along with academic success we believe it is important for our students to have success in the arts. Our specialist art program allows students to succeed in visual arts and our specialist music program allows students to develop skills, along with a love and appreciation for music. Our dance program recently allowed over 50 students to participate in the Southern Tasmanian Dance Eisteddfod, where they were able to experience success through their hard work and preparation. Our religion classes teach everyone about being considerate and compassionate members of society who care to are in need.
