ANNUAL REPORT of the TASMANIAN COUNCIL OF EDUCATION for the Year 1878-9.

To His Excellency FREDERICK ALOYSIUS WELD, Esquire, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Tasmania and its Dependencies.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY.

1. In conformity with the provisions of "The Tasmanian Council of Education and 22Viet. No. 21, Scholarship Act," we have the honor to submit this our Nineteenth Report of the pro-ceedings of the Council from the 1st May, 1878, to the 30th April, 1879.

2. The Hon. J. W. Agnew was elected President for the year ending 30th June, 1879. President.

3. We caused an Examination of Candidates for the Council of Education Exhibitions to be held in the month of June, 1878. Seven Students presented themselves for examination; and, on the recommendation of the Examiners, Exhibitions of the annual Exhibitions, Notice, 25th June, 1878. value of £20 each for four years were awarded to Thomas George Stanton Crouch, pupil of Mr. Ireland, Collegiate School, Hobart Town, and James Harcourt Smith, pupil of the Rev. W. H. Savigny, M.A., Church Grammar School, Launceston. obtained a standard of marks sufficient to entitle them to an Exhibition. Three others

The Examiners in closing their Report observe :-

"The results of the Examination do not compare favourably with those of last year, and of some previous years. The number of candidates was smaller than usual, and the attainments of the foremost are not so high as on some former occasions. The number of competitors, however, has fluctuated, and previous years. few boys now offer themselves for examination except those who are likely to acquit themselves creditably, and who have at least some chance of winning an Exhibition. The boys who have been examined this year have, on the whole, done very well; and we notice with satisfaction that the boy who obtained only the lowest place at the last year's Examination, has won for himself the highest place in the competition of the present year. His industry and perseverance are, in our opinion, very commendable and exemplary.

4. The nineteenth examination for the Degree of Associate of Arts was held in Degree of October, 1877; the Rev. J. E. Bromby, D.D., Melbourne, being Examiner in English, Latin, Greek, Pure Mathematics, and Natural Philosophy; the Hon. F. S. Dobson, M.A., LL.D., Examiner in French and German; Professor Charles H. Pearson, M.A., Ladies' College, Melbourne, Examiner in Italian; and Mr. Henry Hunter, Examiner in Drawing. Eighteen Candidates under nineteen years of age presented themselves; all passed the Preliminary Examination, and sixteen succeeded in obtaining the Degree: eight being placed in the First Class, seven in the Second Class, and one in third Class.

One Candidate over nineteen years of age presented himself for examination, and succeeded in obtaining a Third Class Degree.

William Parkin Goddard, as Senior Associate of the year, received the Council's Gold Medal, and First Prize for Mathematics, and a Prize for Natural Philosophy. To Frederick Lodge, who was placed in the First Class, were awarded First Prizes for English, Latin, and Greek. To Charles Ernest Webster, who was also placed in the First Class, was awarded Second Prize for Mathematics. To Mary Friend Whitney Canaway, who was also placed in the First Class, were awarded First Prizes for English and Italian. To Marion Louisa MacMillan were awarded First Prizes for French and German. To Edward Reginald Nicolson, who was also placed in the First Class, was awarded the Second Prize for Greek. To Thomas Richard Marsden, who was placed in the Second Class, was awarded a Second Prize for French.

Scholars.

Lindsay, A.A., 1875, and George Quinlan Roberts, A.A., 1876, reached the standard prescribed by the Council. A Scholarship was awarded to each, and they have since proceeded to Great Britain to enter upon their University studies. 8. Of the progress of the Tasmanian Scholars since the publication of our last Annual Report we learn that A. Doran, Tasmanian Scholar of 1875, was bracketed first in Sacond Year Classical Examination and the Scholarship obtained by him at the

Annual Report we learn that A. Doran, Tasmanian Scholar of 1875, was bracketed first in Second Year Classical Examination, and the Scholarship obtained by him at the University was increased from £30 to £70. He also, recently, carried off the prize for the best Latin Essay on "The present state of the Wolfian Theory about Homer." H. B. Barrett, Scholar of 1866, was Prizeman in International Law in December last. John G. Lindsay, Scholar of 1878, has entered at Trinity College, Cambridge, having been admitted in Easter Term as a special favour, owing to his work in a Scholarship Examination at which he presented himself.

We regret to have to record the decease of Mr. Charles Caleb Williamson, B.A., Tasmanian Scholar of 1873, which took place in England on the 9th May last, twelve months after his Scholarship had expired.

9. The Dry Scholarship having been declined by the Senior Associate was awarded to Frederick Lodge, second of the list of First Class Associates of Art of the year, he having intimated his intention to proceed with his studies and compete for a Tasmanian Scholarship.

10. Since the publication of our last Report two Examinations of Candidates for Matriculation at the University of Melbourne have been held in Hobart Town under our supervision, with the following result:—July Term, 1878.—One Candidate: failed. October Term, 1878.—Six Candidates: two failed; two, Charles Seymour Dowdell and Charles Ernest Webster, passed both the Matriculation and the Civil Service Examination; and two, Ernest S. Barnett and William Hordern, though failing in the Matriculation Examination, succeeded in passing the Civil Service Examination.

11. Vacancies were created by the retirement of Sir Robert Officer, and by the decease of Morton Allport, Esq., and Philip Turner, Esq., C.B. These have been filled by the election of the Rev. George Clarke, the Hon. Sir James M. Wilson, K.C.M.G., and Thomas Stephens, Esq., M.A.

12. We have much pleasure in stating that the Legislature has been pleased to make provision for two Scholarships for Senior Associate of Arts, each of the value of £40 per annum, and tenable for two years. These Scholarships are designed to assist male Associate of Arts, under 19 years of age, in prosecuting their studies for the Tasmanian Scholarships : they will take effect from the beginning of 1879, and will be conferred on those candidates standing highest on the list who signify their intention to study and compete for the Tasmanian Scholarships.

13. We submit a Statement of the Disbursements of the Council between the 1st January and the 31st December, 1878, the termination of the financial year; together with a Supplementary Statement of Payments between the 1st January and the 30th April, 1879. The total expenditure under every head for the year 1878 is shown to have amounted to ± 2202 17s. 11d.

14. We append to our Report a Roll of the Tasmanian Scholars, a List of those Students who have obtained the Degree of Associate of Arts, and a List of those who obtained Exhibitions offered by the Council.
