

## ANNUAL REPORT for 1876.

Invalid Depôt, Launceston, 22nd February, 1877.

SIR,

I HAVE the honor to forward the usual Annual Report for this Institution for the year 1876.

On the 1st January, 1876, the number of inmates was	121 118
Discharged during the year	239 116
Remaining on the 31st December, 1876	
Daily average number	·81 956

Of those discharged 26 were transferred to Hobart Town on account of the insufficiency of the accommodation in this Institution, 1 to General Hospital, 2 to Police Office for breach of regulations, 2 absconded, and 2 to Hospital for Insane at New Norfolk.

One hundred and eighty-four cases of sickness occurred during the year.

The average age at the time of death was 73.625 years.

The conduct of the inmates has been, with few exceptions, good.

The rations, &c. supplied by various contractors were good.

Appended is a statement showing the expenditure for the year, and the average cost per head.
