

LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

BARRINGTON ROAD:

PETITION.

Presented by Mr. Chapman, February 12; and ordered by the Council to be printed, February 13, 1880.



To the Honorable the President and Members of the Legislative Council, in Parliament assembled.

Your Petitioners the undersigned Residents of Barrington, in the District of West Devon, humbly pray that your Honorable House will, in considering the vote of £1000 for the Barrington Road, so amend the wording of that vote that the expenditure of the money shall be ensured in the direction that will most benefit the inhabitants of the neighbourhood for which it is intended.

The vote as passed by the Honorable House of Assembly was for the road from the junction of the Nook and Formby Road with the Barrington Road to Barrington; but as the Barrington end of that road most urgently calls for attention, being so bad as to almost debar traffic from passing out of the Barrington Settlement, your Petitioners would humbly ask that the vote may be worded "from Barrington northwards towards the junction of Barrington, and Nook, and Formby Road."

And your Petitioners, as in duty bound, shall ever pray.
