



MAIN LINE RAILWAY.

PETITION IN FAVOUR OF, FROM INHABITANTS OF HOBART TOWN.

Presented by Mr. Cook, September 15, 1869, and ordered by the House to be printed.



To the Honorable the Speaker and Members of the House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled.

The humble Petition of the undersigned Citizens of Hobart Town and others.

RESPECTFULLY SHOWETH:

That your Petitioners believe the immediate construction of a Main Line Railway from Hobart Town to Launceston is necessary for the welfare of the Colony.

That your Petitioners accept with satisfaction the proposal of the Government to procure the immediate construction of such Railway, by a plan so obviously within the financial resources of the Colony as that which is now under the consideration of the Legislature.

Your Petitioners therefore humbly pray that your Honorable House will adopt the Resolution on the Main Line Railway, as submitted by the Responsible Advisers of the Crown.

And your Petitioners, as in duty bound, will ever pray.
