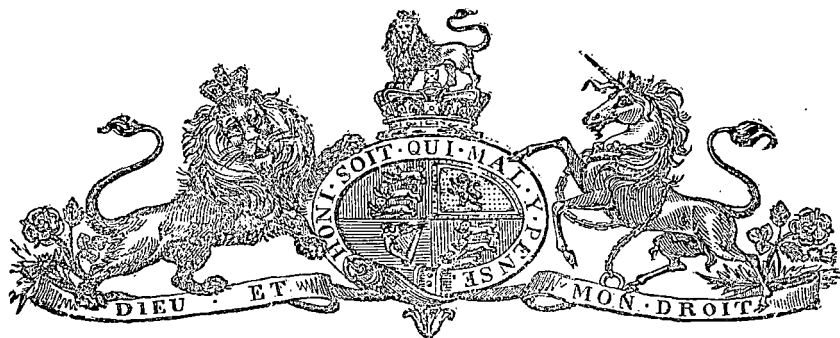

TASMANIA.—No. 89.—LEGISLATIVE.

Government House, Hobart Town, 13th August, 1860.

MY LORD DUKE,

I HAVE the honor to forward to Your Grace the Resolutions of the Legislative Council in reference to their late President, Mr. Justice Horne.

2. They were passed by a majority of that body on the 2nd instant, and were presented to me to-day, by the President, Mr. Nairn, with an Address, of which Copy is enclosed, requesting me to transmit them to Your Grace. The Resolutions record, in eulogistic terms, the Council's appreciation of the services and merits of Mr. Justice Horne as its first elected President.

3. The fourth of the Resolutions, in the closing paragraph of which I am prayed to draw Your Grace's particular attention to the inability of the Council to make any more substantial acknowledgment of the services and merits of Mr. Justice Horne, appears to me to supersede the necessity of any comment, as it so obviously indicates the object sought to be attained.
