HOBART TRAINING SCHOOL REFORMATORY FOR GIRLS.

Barracks, 24th July, 1883.

SIR,

I HAVE the honor to hand you the following Report of the Committee of the "Hobart Training School Reformatory for Girls" for the past twelve months.

The average number of Inmates has been eleven, and the health of the girls has been very good, and especially so considering they are generally received into the Institution in an indifferent state of health.

The yard adjoining the building, recently enclosed, has been very acceptable, as it was greatly needed for air and exercise.

The behaviour of the girls, with occasional exceptions, has been good.

Seven girls were received, and five girls were discharged from the Institution.

Each girl on leaving and accepting a situation as domestic servant, found for them by the Committee, received a serviceable outfit of clothing.

A system of rewards for good conduct, instituted by the Committee, works well.

The girls are employed in washing, housework, and needlework. The sum earned for the Institution by washing amounted to £176 15s. 5d.
