(5)       For the avoidance of doubt, nothing in this section prevents the use of a traditional,  
colloquial or comedic name for a place if such a name is used in good faith in  
circumstances where the use of such a name is unlikely to mislead or deceive another  
person.

Clause 13, as amended, agreed to.

Clauses 14 to 20 agreed to.

Schedules 1 to 3 agreed to.

Title agreed to

Bill to be reported with Amendment.
