## **Forest Peace Agreement**

Between the end of the Second World War and the early 1970's the Tasmanian Hardwood Saw-milling Industry had an unprecedented demand from both its export market, mainly Victoria and also within Tasmania, as post war home building slowly caught up with an unprecedented demand.

The Industry through the Tasmanian Timber Association realised it was overcutting at about double the rate of the long term sustainable growth of State Forests managed by the Forestry Commission.

In co-operative discussion with the senior officers of the Forestry Commission, a plan was devised to reduce the volume of cut to the long term sustainable yield over a period of about five years with the cut being reduced from around 700,000 cubic metres to around 350,000 cubic metres of Category 1 sawlog per annum.

It was at this time that the Southern Tasmanian Saw-millers started the first woodchip export company Tasmanian Pulp and Forest Holdings to gain a profitable market for sawmill residue and move from selective logging which had been degenerating the hardwood forests to clear felling and so efficiently regenerate the hardwood forests.

This all occurred against a background of the Hydro Electric Commission being opposed firstly for the damming of Lake Pedder and then the Gordon River.

When the Greens had succeeded in stopping the Hydro from damming the Gordon below Franklin and future expansion of the potential for generating carbon free electricity, it was made clear that the next target was the lock-up of all Tasmania's forests.

In the early 1980's the Tasmanian Timber Association expanded to become the Forest Industry Association of Tasmania to include Softwood (Radiata Pine) Saw millers, Pulp & Paper Companies and Woodchip Export Companies to form a united front to defend the sustainable industries long term access to State Forests to be managed on a nominal 100 year rotation.

The War over industry access to Tasmania's Forests had begun and Bob Brown emerged as the leader of the Greens.

The area of forests locked up in World Heritage, National Parks and Reserves saw each supposed settlement likened to the Ratchet Effect where the lever is pulled the pall drops in and never goes backwards and the next battle begins.

This latest attempt at a "Forest Peace Agreement" has seen the volume of Category 1 Hardwood sawlog reduced from the 1982 Legislated amount of 317,000 cubic metres to 135,000 cubic metres and the area of Tasmania locked up exceeding 60%. Will this see the end of the forest war?

It appears that while there is breath in Bob Brown's body the achievement of lock up of ALL Tasmanian forests is the target and he still has a group of militant followers with their hands on the lever to keep pulling and dropping in the pall.
