

Civil Commandant's Office, Port Arthur, 1st March, 1874.

I HAVE the honor to forward herewith Returns Nos. 1 and 2, showing the actual cost of maintenance of Convicts, Paupers, Hospital Patients, and Lunatics, for the year ending 31st December, 1873.

It will be seen on reference to my estimates for 1873 that the cost of the various classes was as under :

When the estimate for 1873 was prepared, the meat was calculated at 20s. per 100 lbs., whereas the actual cost of meat for the year amounted to $3\frac{1}{2}\frac{7}{3}d$. or nearly $3\frac{2}{3}d$, per lb.

The other classes are under the estimate.

The causes necessitating the increase in the cost of a convict are-

1st. The increased price of meat.

2nd. My inability to send to Town 6 bales of wool in time for the December sales; and

3rd. Credit not given for £41 3s. 10d. paid into the Treasury in January for supplies paid for by Stipendiaries in December last.

SIR.

Civil Commandant's Office, Port Arthur, 18th March, 1874.

I HAVE the honor to submit my Report for the year ending 31st December, 1873.

It will be seen on reference to the accompanying Return, marked A 1, that the total cost of the Establishment for the year 1873 amounted to $\pounds 10,714$.

Return A 2 shows the division under the various headings of expense, net cost per class, and net cost per inmate.

When the estimate was prepared the calculations were made for an average strength of 525 men of all classes. During the year the average strength was 483 men,-thus slightly increasing the cost of an effective prisoner.

The amount due by Imperial Government for maintenance of convicts, paupers, and lunatics is $\pounds7198$ 3s. 4d.,—leaving a balance of $\pounds3515$ 16s. 8d. to be paid by the Colony for the maintenance of about 230 Colonial convicts, or £15 5s. 6d. per head; but, by further deducting the value of six

bales of wool in store, £60, and £41 3s. 10d. paid into the Treasury for December, 1873, not credited, the cost of an effective prisoner, both Imperial and Colonial, is decreased by about 8s. per head,—thus leaving the actual cost of a Colonial prisoner at £14 17s. 6d.

CONDUCT OF PRISONERS.

The conduct of the prisoners as a body has been satisfactory. The number punished magisterially was 75, out of an aggregate strength of 339. The increase, as compared with 1872, will be found in minor offences.—*Vide* Return marked B.

Return marked C shows the labour classes of the prisoners on the 31st December, 1873, as compared with the classes on the 31st December, 1872.

Employment of Prisoners.

During the year the able-bodied prisoners have been principally employed in the manufacture of boots and shoes for this Establishment, and the Departments in Hobart Town, Launceston, and New Norfolk; in procuring firewood, logs for the saw-mill, palings, posts, rails, shingles; tanning leather, wool-washing, and in raising vegetables in aid of rations, &c.—Vide Return marked D.

The estimated value at contract prices of all agricultural, dairy, and other produce raised during the year, including the amount paid for labour, &c. by stipendiaries, amounts to £2306 ls. ld.— Vide Return E.

The estimated value of timber sawn and split, bricks, firewood, charcoal, shingles, &c. amounts to the sum of £1789 14s. 6d.—Vide Return F.

The estimated value of all articles of clothing, &c. made and repaired (the value being charged at prison rates), repairs to buildings, tinsmith, blacksmith, and carpenter's work, clothing and bedding washed, &c. amounts to £1149 Ss. 3d.—Vide Return G.

DEATHS.

Return H, annexed, shows the number of effective convicts, invalids, paupers, and lunatics who have died during the year, and rate per cent.

ESCAPES.

During the year only one prisoner, named John Smith, absconded from the Settlement; and, as that was through the neglect of the senior constable, his services were dispensed with. Smith was apprehended at Wedge Bay, after having been illegally at large for a period of 12 days.

CONDUCT OF OFFICERS.

I have much pleasure in acknowledging the cordial support I have received from both officers and constables, which has enabled me to maintain thoroughly the discipline of the Establishment.

The strength of the staff will be seen on reference to Return I.

BUILDINGS.

The public offices, station officers' quarters, and about three-fourths of the penitentiary have been re-shingled, and certain alterations effected at the Pauper Depôt.

A new sheep-dip has been erected at Salt-water River, as per plan furnished by the Chief Inspector. Many slight repairs have been effected to the buildings and officers' quarters.

SOAP.

The manufacture of soap from the refuse fat has been continued during the year, the value of which amounts to $\pounds 77$ 12s.

VISITORS.

His Excellency the Governor visited and inspected all parts of the Establishment on the 27th of March, and was pleased to leave a record of his visit,—a copy of which I annex, with the entries made by other visitors during the year, amongst which will be found the names of the former and present members of the Government, who made an official inspection of the Establishment.
