

ANNUAL REPORT of the Brickfields Pauper Establishment for 1875.

SIR,

I have the honor to forward to the Government the Annual Report of the Brickfields Pauper Establishment for the year ending December 31st, 1875.

In presenting this Report I have to state that it will bear favourable comparison with former years, notwithstanding that the average number of Inmates has increased from 245 in 1874, to 265 1875, and the expenditure is under the estimate as provided by Parliament.

With respect to the labour of the Inmates they are still employed in Park-street, commencing at the Domain Gate, near Stoke-street; some progress has been made in that locality.

In February 20 men were sent as a working party to the Public Cemetery, New Town. They have done a great deal of work, and have given very little trouble. I have visited three times a week upon an average during the year.

The conduct of the Inmates on the whole has been good.

His Excellency the Governor and other gentlemen have continued to supply newspapers and a few books for the library, and also visited the Institution: to whom thanks are due for their kindness.

Religious instruction has been imparted by the different Ministers of Religion to the Inmates in a regular and satisfactory manner.
