



SIR,

In the absence of the Superintendent on sick leave, I have the honor to forward herewith the Annual Returns showing the working and cost of the Establishment for the year 1880.

It will be observed that the gross cost per head is £36 11s. 3d., less by credit of cash payments to Treasury for prison labour, which reduces the cost to the actual sum of £25 10s. 10d. per head. There was on hand on the 31st December, 1880, stores, bedding, and clothing to the value of £678 4s. 8d., which amount has been charged against the Establishment. If credit was given for this sum it would reduce the cost of each Prisoner to £21 19s. 10½d. per head.
