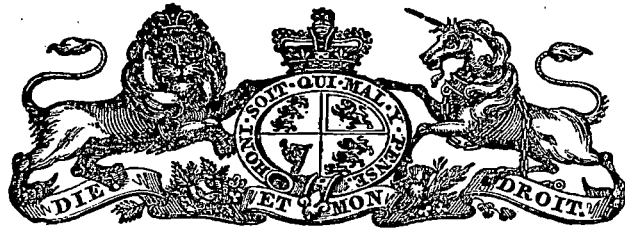

PETITION FOR THE OPENING OF WHITE'S ROAD.

Presented by Mr. Sibley, September 22, 1870, and ordered by the House to be printed.



*To the Honorable the Speaker and Members of the House of Assembly, in  
Parliament assembled.*

The Petition of the undersigned Landholders and Residents of Hamilton.

HUMBLY SHOWETH :

THAT they are informed that the Road from Hamilton, known as White's Road, passing over Hamilton Plains and through the Broad Bottom has been gazetted as closed.

Your Petitioners therefore pray that you will take the matter into your most favourable consideration, as the road has been an open road for upwards of Fifty Years.

Your Petitioners also beg to state, that many of your Petitioners have purchased land on the Hamilton Plains fronting on this Line of Road, and most of them depend upon this Road for carting their grain, &c. to Market.

Your Petitioners beg further to state, that there is a spring of water in the road boundary leading through the Broad Bottom which principally supplies the Hamilton Plains with water, and by closing this Road will put your Petitioners to great expense and inconvenience.

Your Petitioners also beg to state, that by closing the Road (which has always been considered a Main Road) it will be a great loss to many of your Petitioners who have purchased land on the Hamilton Plains, fully believing that it was an open and Public Road.

And your Petitioners will ever pray, as in duty bound.
