- 2 ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF TRADITIONAL PEOPLE. The Speaker made a statement acknowledging the traditional people of the land.
- 3 PRAYERS AND REFLECTION. The Speaker read Prayers.
- **4** QUESTIONS SEEKING INFORMATION. In accordance with Standing Order No. 43, Questions without notice were asked.
- **5** PAPERS. The Minister for Environment and Parks laid upon the Table of the House the following Paper:-

**6** PUBLIC WORKS, PARLIAMENTARY STANDING COMMITTEE ON: REPORT BROUGHT UP. – Mrs *Petrusma* brought up the following Report of the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works:-

Report on TasTAFE Energy Trades and Water Centre of Excellence (Paper No. 7).

Ordered, That the said Report be received and printed. (Mrs Petrusma)

7 BILL NO. 4. – The Minister for Justice presented -

"A Bill for an Act to amend the Guardianship and Administration Act 1995".

And Ms Archer having presented the said Bill, the same was read the First time and made an Order of the Day for tomorrow.

8 BILL NO. 7. – Ms O'Connor presented -

"A Bill for an Act to amend the Residential Tenancy Act 1997 for the purposes of regulating rent increases and allowing for rent reduction orders".

And Ms O'Connor having presented the said Bill, the same was read the First time and made an Order of the Day for tomorrow.

The Right to Peaceful Protest.
