1 COUNCIL MEETS.— The Council met at 11.00 o'clock in the forenoon and the President read Prayers.

2 PAPERS.— The Clerk of the Council laid upon the Table the Returns Under Section 19 of the Public Account Act 1986, June Quarter 2018. Section 12A Supplementary Estimates. Additional Expenditure for the Financial Year ended 30 June 2018.

3 BILL NO. 28.— The National Redress Scheme of Institutional Child Sexual Abuse (Commonwealth Powers) Bill 2018 was read the Third time and passed.

4 BILL NO. 28.— A Message to the House of Assembly:—

MADAM SPEAKER,

The Legislative Council has this day agreed, without Amendment, to a Bill intituled — ‘A Bill for an Act to adopt the National Redress Scheme for Institutional Child Sexual Abuse Act 2018 of the Commonwealth and to refer certain matters relating to the National Redress Scheme for Institutional Child Sexual Abuse to the Parliament of the Commonwealth for the purposes of section 51 (xxxvii) of the Constitution of the Commonwealth’.

Clauses 1 to 5 agreed to.

Clause 6 Amendment made (Ms *Forrest*)

Page 9, proposed new section 5A, subsection (6), paragraph (a).

Leave out that paragraph.

Insert instead the following paragraph:

- (a) is to be published, before the notice is to have effect –
 - (i) in the *Gazette*; and
 - (ii) in at least one daily newspaper generally circulating in each municipal area where a shop, to which the notice relates, operates; and
 - (iii) on a website that is accessible by the public; and

Clause as amended, agreed to.

Clauses 7 to 11 agreed.

Schedule 1 agreed.

Title agreed to.

Bill to be reported with Amendment.

The Council being resumed, Ms *Rattray* reported that the Committee had gone through the Bill, and directed her to report the same to the Council with Amendment.

Ordered, That the consideration of the Bill as amended in Committee be made an Order of the Day for tomorrow. (Mrs *Hiscutt*)
