Notices of Motion

- The Minister for Veterans' Affairs to move—That the House:—
 - (1) Acknowledges:—
 - (a) the anniversary of the Battle of Britain, fought between July and October 1940, as one of the pivotal moments in World War II, where Allied forces, led by the Royal Air Force (RAF), successfully defended the United Kingdom against large-scale attacks by Nazi Germany's Luftwaffe; and
 - (b) the commemorative ceremonies held across Australia, including those, on the 15 September 2024 in Tasmania, to pay tribute to the men and women who fought in the Battle of Britain.
 - (2) Recognises:—
 - (a) the bravery and sacrifice of Tasmanian, 23-year-old Flight Commander Stuart Walch who served with the 238 Squadron. Before his death, Flight Commander Walch led several successful raids against the Luftwaffe;
 - (b) the contributions of the Australian men and women who served in the Battle of Britain, noting that Australians, including pilots, aircrew and ground staff, played a crucial role in this air conflict; and
 - (c) the ongoing importance of remembering and educating future generations about Australia's contributions to the Allied war effort, including through significant historical events such as the Battle of Britain, which continues to resonate with Tasmanians and Australians as a symbol of courage, resilience, and sacrifice.
 - (3) Pays tribute to the work of the Tasmanian Division of the Royal Australian Air Force Association (RAAFA), which continues to honour the service of Australian airmen and airwomen through commemoration activities, including wreath-laying ceremonies and memorial services.
 - (4) Thanks all veterans and their families for their service and sacrifices. (17 September 2024)
- The Minister for Veterans' Affairs to move—That the House:—
 - (1) Acknowledges the significance of the Final Report of the Royal Commission into Defence and Veteran Suicide, tabled in September 2024, which highlighted deep systemic issues affecting the welfare of veterans and their families.
 - (2) Recognises the extensive process undertaken by the Royal Commission, including hearings, private sessions and 5,889 submissions received including from the Tasmanian Government.
 - (3) Notes:—
 - (a) with concern the Commission's findings that between 1985 and 2021, 2,007 confirmed suicides occurred among the Australian Defence Forces (ADF)

- personnel, with higher suicide risks observed in certain cohorts compared to the general population; and
- (b) the impact on families, recognising that inadequate support and bureaucratic delays not only affect the veterans but also have significant consequences for the mental health and stability of their families.
- (4) Emphasises the importance of supporting veterans and their families, particularly during the critical period of transitioning from military to civilian life, a time identified as high-risk for mental health challenges and suicidality.
- (5) Further recognises:—
 - (a) the vital role that Veterans' Hubs play in providing essential support to veterans and their families, offering services ranging from mental health care to social reintegration and family assistance; and
 - (b) the success of the Veterans Hub here in Tasmania.
- (6) Supports the Royal Commission's recommendation for ongoing funding to these hubs, ensuring that more veterans and their families can access tailored, trauma-informed care regardless of their geographic location.
- (7) Calls for ongoing, long-term funding commitment from the Federal Government to support the recommendations of the Royal Commission. (17 September 2024)
