*REPORT for the Year ending 30 June, 1863.*

---

THE Trustees of the Campbell Town Hospital have the honor to present to the Subscribers their Annual Report for the financial year ending 30 June, 1863, in accordance with the Rules of the Hospital.

P. H. Gell, Esq., having resigned on the 4th January the office of Trustee and Treasurer, in consequence of leaving the Colony, Charles Leake, Esq., was elected to fill the vacancy; and Henry Kemmis, Esq., Master of the Campbell Town Grammar School, kindly consented to fill the vacancy in the office of Auditor caused by the departure from the Colony of Dr. Boyd.

A Tabular Statement is appended to this Report, showing the number of Cases treated during the year, together with number of Deaths. This statement, being necessarily in a certain form in accordance with the requirements of the Government, hardly gives due credit to Dr. Valentine, whose regular attendance and incessant exertions cannot be too highly commended.

The cordial thanks of the Trustees and Subscribers are also due to the Clergy of the District for their frequent visits, and the great interest shown by them in the Patients.

The subscriptions still continue to come in most liberally: many gentlemen in this and other Districts having voluntarily come forward without the necessity of a reminder; and in other cases the replies to the reminding Circulars have been most prompt and liberal. Still it is much to be desired that those who have not paid will do so, in order to entitle this Institution to the Government Aid for the present year.

The Grant in aid by the Government, of £200 for the year, has passed the House of Assembly without discussion, showing a feeling on the part of the public to appreciate the advantages of the Institution; and the balance now in hand will, the Trustees hope, be most satisfactory to the subscribers and the general public.

Your Trustees have much satisfaction in reporting that the conduct of the Master and Matron have been most exemplary; and that their duties have been most efficiently performed, with a great saving as compared with the former arrangement,
