

SCOTTSDALE AND RINGAROOMA ROAD.

PETITION FROM 238 MERCHANTS, TRADERS, AND OTHERS.

Presented by the Minister of Lands and Works, and ordered by the House to be printed, October 26, 1877.



To His Excellency F. A. Weld, Esq., C.M.G., Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Island of Tasmania and its Dependencies, &c.

The Petition of the undersigned Merchants, Traders, and others interested in the District of Scottsdale and Ringarooma.

That your Petitioners being impressed with the great importance of having the most direct communication between Launceston, Scottsdale, and Ringarooma, and finding that no provision is made in the present scheme of Public Works for the completion of the road viâ Pattersonia, which is the direct road to these localities, and one of the most important Main Roads in the Colony;

Your Petitioners therefore humbly pray that Your Excellency will be pleased to order such measures as will ensure the speedy construction of a proper Main Line of Road between Launceston and Ringarooma $vi\hat{a}$ Scottsdale and Pattersonia.
