- 1 **COUNCIL MEETS.** The Council met at 11.00 o'clock in the forenoon.
- **2 ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF TRADITIONAL PEOPLE.** The President said: "We meet today on Tasmanian Aboriginal land. We acknowledge and pay respect to the Tasmanian Aboriginal people and elders, past and present. We recognise them as the traditional and original owners and the continuing custodians of this land."
- **PRAYERS.** The President read Prayers.
- **4 PAPER.** The Clerk of the Council laid upon the Table the Taxi and Hire Vehicle Industries Act 2008: Statutory Rules 2022, No. 64, containing Taxi Industry Amendment (Remote Electronic Updates) Regulations 2022.
- **DISCLOSURE OF MEMBERS' INTERESTS.**—In accordance with Sections 19 and 20 of the *Parliamentary (Disclosure of Interests) Act 1996* (Act No. 22), the Clerk of the Council laid upon the Table of the Council the Primary Return of the newly elected Member for Pembroke and the Register of Members' Interests for 2021/2022 for Members representing the electoral divisions of Derwent; Elwick; Hobart; Launceston; McIntyre; Mersey; Montgomery; Murchison; Nelson; Prosser; Rosevears; Rumney; and Windermere;

The Primary Return and the Ordinary Returns having been lodged with the President and this day Tabled and placed on the public record, are deemed to have been published.

- **6 BILL NO. 20.** The Vehicle and Traffic Amendment (Driver Distraction and Speed Enforcement) Bill 2022 was read the Third time and passed.

"fair and equitable transition" means a transition towards a lowcarbon economy that is just and fair and maximises opportunities for decent jobs, economic prosperity and social inclusion;

Page 9, proposed new section 5, after subsection (2).

Insert the following subsections:

- (3) Within 12 months after the day on which the Climate Change (State Action) Amendment Act 2022 takes effect, the Minister is to set an absolute greenhouse gas emissions reduction target for Tasmania to achieve by no later than 31 December 2030.
- (4) The Minister is to review and reset the absolute greenhouse gas emissions target whenever a climate change action plan is prepared.
- (5) In this section -

"absolute greenhouse gas emissions" means measured or estimated greenhouse gas emissions which do not include any account of carbon sequestration through natural or artificial processes.

Question put, That the amendment be agreed to.
