Page 8, paragraph (a)

.Leave out the paragraph

.Insert instead the following paragraph:

(a) recognising that housing is a fundamental human right, increase the opportunities for eligible persons, and persons on low or moderate incomes, to live in safe, secure appropriate and affordable housing;

#### Third amendment

Page 8, paragraph (b).

Leave out all the words after subparagraph (ii).

#### Fourth amendment

Page 9, paragraph (h).

Leave out the paragraph.

*Insert instead* the following paragraph:

- (h) to ensure the existence of viable, diverse and accessible -
  - (i) services for the provision of housing assistance,
  - (ii) housing support services; and
  - (iii) services related to homelessness;

Clause 3 as amended, agreed to.

Clauses 4 to 7 agreed to.

To report progress and seek leave to sit again.
