Subject: Submission on the Proposed Arts, Entertainment, and Sports Precinct in Hobart

The financial risks associated with the project are alarming. The disproportionate burden on the Tasmanian taxpayer, coupled with the lack of AFL's financial commitment and risk-sharing, raises questions about the project's viability and the government's responsibility to protect public funds.

Terms of Reference 4: Financing and Delivery

The financial assumptions, infrastructure costs, and overall economic viability of the project need thorough examination. The potential impact on housing, health, and education priorities should be prioritized over a stadium project that lacks community support and has dubious financial feasibility.

Terms of Reference 5: Impact on Existing Facilities

The addition of a third stadium in the south appears socially divisive, with substitution costs affecting the northern economy. A comprehensive option study, considering the impact on existing facilities and the criteria for success, is essential for a fair evaluation.

Terms of Reference 6: Incidental Matters

Considering other matters incidental to the proposed precinct, it is crucial to evaluate the wideranging impacts on all stakeholders. Stakeholder importance should be weighed judiciously, ensuring a balanced and inclusive approach.

In conclusion, I urge the committee to thoroughly investigate the concerns raised in this submission and consider the long-term implications of the proposed Arts, Entertainment, and Sports Precinct. Our taxpayer funds should be directed toward addressing critical needs such as housing, health, and education. Thank you for your attention to this matter. I trust that your inquiry will ensure a comprehensive and impartial assessment of the proposed project.
