

To the Honorable Members of the House of Assembly of Tasmania, in Parliament assembled.

The Petition of the Landholders and Householders of the Rural Municipality of New Norfolk.

## GENTLEMEN.

WE, the undersigned Landholders and Householders of the Rural Municipality of New Norfolk, beg leave most respectfully to address your Honorable House.

It has been made known to us that the Ministry has introduced a measure, intituled "The Public Loans Security Act," having for its object the making Landed and Household Property liable for the Interest of all Debentures which have, and which may hereafter be issued.

Looking with alarm on the power given to any Government by this Bill to tax to an unlimited extent, and considering the impost both unfair and obnoxious, we therefore humbly pray that such Bill may not pass into Law.
