

## KANGAROO:

PETITIONS IN FAVOUR OF BILL FOR PROTECTING.

Presented by Mr. Maclanachan, August 26 and 27; and ordered by the Council to be printed, September 1, 1874.



To the Honorable the President and other Honorable Members of the Legislative Council of Tasmania, in Parliament assembled.

WE, the undersigned inhabitants of the Municipal District of Oatlands, being of opinion that unless some legal provision be made to prevent the present wholesale destruction of that most useful and interesting animal the Kangaroo, the said animal will within a very short period become utterly extinct, earnestly pray that your Honorable House will be pleased to pass into law the Bill for the Protection of Kangaroo, introduced into the other House of Parliament by the Honorable Member for Cumberland.

And your Petitioners will ever pray.
