

SIR.

THE Trustees of the Tasmanian Public Library, in compliance with Clause 7 of the Act to provide for the Incorporation and Government of that Institution (34 Vict. No. 27), beg to submit the following Report of its working during the year 1882.

REPORT.

- 1. The Trustees, in presenting their Twelfth Annual Report, have to record that during the past year 19,147 visits have been registered in the Visitors' Book. It must again be mentioned that a very large number of those who frequent the Institution neglect to register their visits, and the Trustees have had under consideration the desirability of adopting some more certain method of registering the actual daily attendance, which is very much greater than the Visitors' Book ever shows. Unfortunately, the construction of the building prevents the erection of a turnstile similar to the one which registers the attendance at the Melbourne Public Library.
- 2. The Trustees have pleasure in reporting that the privileges afforded by the Institution are fully appreciated, and that the practice of keeping the rooms open on Sunday afternoons and on all public holidays is still maintained, and fully taken advantage of by the public.
- 3. During the year 216 volumes have been added to the Library by purchase and presentation, and several orders for books have been forwarded to England through Messrs. Walch & Sons, which, on their completion, will be partly paid for out of the amounts recently voted by Parliament in aid of the Institution.

The additions which are constantly being made to the stock of books in the Library will shortly necessitate the expenditure of a special vote to provide extra shelving accommodation.

4. The Trustees have pleasure in recording that during last Session of Parliament a sum of £206 15s. 10d. was voted from Escheated Estates in aid of the Public Library.

The Trustees would continue to urge upon the Government and Parliament the great claims of the Institution, which is mainly sustained at the cost of the inhabitants of Hobart, but open to all persons who may choose to avail themselves of its advantages.

The City, Council has voted a sum of £486 for Library purposes for the year 1882, the estimated expenditure being as follows:—
