

The Contagious Diseases Hospital, The Cascades, Hobart, 28th January, 1896.

Sir,

Out of the admissions for the year 19 patients were treated for the first time.

Birth-place and Religion of Inmates.

Twenty-two were born in Tasmania, one in New South Wales, one in South Australia, one in England, one in Ireland, one in Portugal, and one on the sea. Twenty-four were Protestants, and four were Roman Catholics.

Ages.

The average age was 22 years, the youngest was 14 years, and the oldest was 59 years.

Conduct.

The patients conducted themselves satisfactorily during the year, and received every care and attention from the Nurse.
